## PROJECT FOR SAFEGUARDING OUR LOCAL TERRAPINS AND HABITATS

## AND RECOLLECTING INVASORY SPECIES

A successful volunteer day on Saturday December 14<sup>th</sup>, 2013

A small lake close to the cost and Mario-Waterpark had been detected as nature reserve for native terrapins and waterfowl.

Actually a golf course is planned there in one of the last remaining nature sites in between coastline, greenhouses and urbanizations.

And of course men already left its traces by releasing American terrapins like cooters and sliders. What else do we know.. But we caught by trapping actually two *Trachemys* specimens within one hour on this sunny winter day.

The "ARCO-Van" served as exhibition place showing power point prints on the project and conservation efforts. The trailer had been used as working platform and exhibition table for exotic invasive turtles.



The project had been initiated by our collaborating partner and Almeria's leading herpetologist Emilio Gonzalez Miras, also co-authoring our booklet on "Amphibians and Reptiles of Almeria".

The association for environmental education GAIA co-organized and supported that day out in the field and ARCO had been present with exhibitional, educational and informative contributions, also with coorganizing traps, floating islands, species registration and others.
